



- One contested race and one ballot issue await you Tuesday, April 3, 2012, when the polls open at 6am. Ward three has a contested race between incumbent Kevin Dennis and Mike Povich.
- Also on the ballot, is a tax increase measure for the Tourism Tax, increasing from 2% to 5% of the amount charged to guests at the motels, and to expand the areas where the money can be used. Expanding the scope to include advertising, handout materials, fliers, and more promotional type activities can generate more visitors, helping the local motel operators.
- In turn, this could help the City by generating more sales at local shops and eateries. We can promote our festivals, car cruises, ball tournaments, and more. Get out and let your voice be heard at your ward polling location.

2012 Spring Clean-Up

Services— The annual Spring clean-up provided by IESI will be held on Saturday, April 21, 2012, at the Public Works parking lot from 8am-4pm. There will be a dumpster for yard waste, bulk items, and recycling. IESI employees will be on site to assist with larger items. Hazardous materials are not accepted.

Midwest Recycling Center-This company will also be on site for the purpose collecting electronic recyclables. Generally, there is a fee to collect TVs and monitors. We did receive a grant to pay for this service, so this is your chance to recycle your old TVs at no charge! Other items they recycle are appliances, computers, DVD players, printers, etc.

Building Code Update-

The City of Festus adopted the 2009 ICC Building Codes. The new codes will go into effect on April 12, 2012. Copies of the code book, deletions, and additions will be available at the Festus Public Library for review. You can make copies, but cannot remove them from the Library. Swimming Pool Guidelines

Pool permits are required for any pool that is two (2) feet deep or deeper. This includes blow up pools.

- Pool structures must be at least five (5) feet from the property lines (rear and side) and six feet from the house.
- The pool must have a minimum of a 48 inch barrier. This
 can be a chain link or slat fence with openings no larger
 than four (4) inches.
- · Pools cannot be installed over the top of utility easements
- Electric running to pools must be installed underground.
